Project Rose (SQL Reporting Optimization)

Loomis' core business is cash management. And like any asset that you entrust to a third party, you require visibility. The problem arises when your data warehouse is not exactly built for reporting performance.

And that was the case for Loomis' vault management reporting infrastructure. Reports would sometimes take as long as 10+ minutes to run, crash the application, or just timeout altogether.

My team, along with SME resources from our business units, developed a solution that dropped the total reporting time from minutes to milliseconds. At its core, our solution was an ETL process that denormalized the data warehouse for every report. Simple as that. Each ETL ran independently and stored data in its own table, specifically crafted for high performance reporting.

Loomis Direct and Cirrus Micro-Services

When I took over the Loomis Direct platform (Loomis Direct is Loomis' customer-facing reporting portal), we had a vision to modernize and decouple the many (so... so many) services into independent micro-services. The benefits of a micro-service architecture suited our needs well, and allowed us to move faster on customer and business needs.

Next, we started to take a look at the fractured and fragmented user experience that customers had interacting with the Loomis Direct platform. Our solution was to rebuild the platform from the ground up, as a single, unified experience. This effort is still ongoing even to this day, and is the main responsibility of me and my team.
